VOTING BY MAIL BALLOT IS EASY

1. In Florida, voters don't need to provide a reason to request a mail ballot. Voting by mail provides voters with the flexibility and convenience to vote from their homes.
2. Complete and sign the mail ballot application. We included an extra application card for other voters in your house. Any registered eligible voter may vote by mail. All eligible mail ballots are counted in an election, the same as precinct ballots and early voting ballots.

Your Signature and date of birth are REQUIRED.

3. A ballot must be requested no later than 5 p.m. the Wednesday prior to an election in order for the Elections office to mail it to you.
